The American Folk Song



The People, Yes

One of the most celebrated poets of all time, Carl Sandburg's epic *The People, Yes* is filled with sweeping and everlasting images of the American experience giving context to everyday language and observation and language. *The People, Yes* includes biographical background, spoken-word selections and songs from *The American Songbag*.



Once I Had an Old Banjo The 5-string banjo is said to be America's only original folk instrument. Though its development coincides with the early history of the United States, scholars now agree that the 5-string banjo originated in Africa. *Once I Had an Old Banjo* is packed with songs and fascinating lore surrounding the origin of this uniquely American instrument. The presentation includes selections from the historic minstrel show era, songs and stories from old-time mountain traditions and examples from masters of the 5-string banjo.



The Life & Songs of Woody Guthrie is a scripted presentation which includes a biographical background on Guthrie, readings from his vast collection of essays and letters and of course, plenty of great songs from America's iconic ballad maker. Dvorak served for thirty-years as an integral member of the faculty at the Old Town School of Folk Music in Chicago IL and has spent a lifetime following in the musical steps of Woody Guthrie.



Chasing the Great Lead Belly In the summer of 1990, Mark set out towards Louisiana in search of the grave of the great Huddie Ledbetter. The trip was chronicled in the 1993 documentary *Lead Belly's Legacy,* produced for WDCB public radio, Glen Ellyn IL. The show aired in 160 cities and won a Peter Lisagor Award for journalism. Dvorak recreates the original script in *Chasing the Great Lead Belly,* complete with narration and thirteen classic songs from the singing of the great Lead Belly.
